
60TH ANNIVERSARY KICK OFF CEREMONY

This September, we were greeted with the diamond jubilee of our school—the 60th year since Bishop Hall founded the school. Standing firm for 6 decades, this event truly connects us students as one; students of the past, and of the present each decade, as students from different generations of the school's long history celebrate. After a long period of pandemic restrictions that stopped our school from holding assemblies, Jubileans were delighted to finally connect with each other.

An exciting opening ceremony was held where several representatives from different houses held makeshift torches and raced to deliver golden pins and presents to classes to commemorate the 60th Anniversary. Each representative live-streamed their own delivery to each class, adding tension and excitement to the event. The torches and gift-giving symbolised higher forms passing on the BHJS spirit to their juniors.



To conclude the kick-off ceremony and officially commemorate the 60th Anniversary, teachers in the hall held their hands over a large crystal ball, which showed a hologram of the anniversary logo. SU CONSULTATION

DIALOGUE WITH DR LEE

WHO'S YB? LET'S KNOW MORE ABOUT HIM!

Dr Lee Yui Bor (YB) graduated from BHJS in 1965. He took Electrical Engineering at the University of Hong Kong and earned a BSc (Hons) degree in 1970. He furthered his studies in the UK and was awarded DIC and MSc (Eng) with distinction at Imperial College London, in 1972. In 1973, he joined the University of Bath for research and received his PhD in 1975.

Working in CLP Holdings for 30 years, Dr Lee held various key positions, including Chief Planning Engineer, Managing Director of CLP Power (China), and Group Executive Director when he retired in 2007. Under his leadership, CLP developed and managed a portfolio of joint ventures on the Mainland, which made the company the biggest foreign investor in

the Chinese Power Sector. After retirement, he remained on the CLP Board as Non-executive Director until 2019.

Dr Lee taught final-year and postgraduate students and conducted research in power system engineering at the University of New South Wales in Australia from 1985-87. He was also an Honorary Professor at the Faculty of Engineering at the University of Hong Kong from 2007-19.

Being an Honorary Fellow of the Association of Electricity Supply Industry in East Asia and Western Pacific and elected President in 1992, Dr Lee is a Fellow of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers and a Chartered Engineer.
